Study Guide for Lesson-03: Wisdom from Above

Lesson Focus Passage: Daniel 2:1-30

Background: King Nebuchadnezzar is by far the most important pagan king in the entire Bible. More press is given to him than to any other Gentile ruler. He is in fact the first Gentile ruler to interrupt the nation of **Judah** and its leadership.

Yet according to Daniel 4:17 (KJV), he was the basest of all men.

He was a wicked, despotic king who stands, in many respects, as a type of the antichrist because of his cruel and Satan-inspired behavior. All men trembled before this king; he trembled before nothing. Nothing, that is, except his dreams.
