## **Lesson-15 Study Guide: Finishing Strong**

**Lesson Focus Passage: Daniel 12** 

**Background:** Daniel is told that his people (Israel) would be delivered in the end, "every one who is found written in the book" (Daniel 12:1).

The idea of God having a book in which the names and deeds of people are written occurs throughout Scripture. Names can be blotted out of the book (Exodus 32:32-33; Deuteronomy 29:20), and the book records the tears of the people of God as well as their names (Psalm 56:8).

Having one's name written in heaven is a cause for rejoicing (<u>Luke 10:20</u>). The New Testament calls it "**the Book of Life**" (<u>Philippians 4:3</u>), and it is not surprisingly mentioned in Revelation (seven times) more than any other place (<u>Revelation 3:5; 13:8; 17:8; 20:12, 15; 21:27; 22:19</u>).

  - a. Even though Israel is their ancestral home, where do many Jews still live today?
  - b. What did God promise He would do one day regarding all Jews?
  - c. Why is the Jews' current home among the nations likened by God to being in a wilderness?
- 2. How do you reconcile <u>Jeremiah 31:35-37</u> with God's present and future judgment of the nation of Israel?
- 3. Describe the characteristics of God you find in the following verses, and explain why each is a reason to trust Him with that which He has not revealed to us.
  - a. Psalm 90:2
  - b. I Kings 8:27
  - c. I Timothy 1:17
